METHODIST CHURCH TO CELEBRATE 180 YEARS OF CONTINUOUS WORSHIP AND SERVICE IN KNOX COUNTY

The same year that the City of Knoxville was established, the first Christian congregation met in a tin shop when the town was little more than a few cabins on the frontier, and it is still active today. The City and Knoxville United Methodist Church will celebrate 180 years with a variety of community and worship activities on Sept. 16, 17 and 18.

The anniversary will carry a historic theme to demonstrate frontier worship in the early 1800's: including a Revival meeting, a Peter Cartwright recreation, Native American worship performance, historic parade, pie baking contest, and gospel music concert.

Rev. Christopher Ritter of Geneseo, will lead a community revival service with music from the Harvest Worship Band of Troy, at 7 p.m. on Sept. 16 at the Fairgrounds, right off I-74 in Knoxville.

On Sept. 17, the Masonic Lodge will offer community breakfast starting at 7 a.m. At 10:a.m., the Day Spring Singers from East Peoria will perform Native American worship singing and dance. This service will replicate how Indian converts to Christianity approached the Lord. Their mission is, "To share Native American traditions, spirituality and the teachings of Jesus Christ in an intertribal community welcome to all."

There will be a pie baking contest and auction. Pies should be delivered for judging to the Hurd-Hendricks Fellowship Hall by 10 a.m. The Knoxville Museum will be open from 10 a.m. to noon. It offers an extensive collection of rare and well-preserved frontier artifacts including the horse drawn buggy that transported Abraham Lincoln to his famous debate with Stephen Douglas in Galesburg.

Starting at 11 a.m. there will be Heritage games for the children and several Knoxville Churches will open 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. for tours -- which will include the fabulous pipe organ at the Presbyterian Church and an amazing array of stained glass creations in several churches. At noon, the Knoxville Volunteer Fire Department will offer lunch at the fire station.

There will be a parade featuring historic dress, horse and wagons and more modern entries at 1 p.m.

Rev. Joel Catlin of O'Fallen First UMC will recreate circuit riding preacher Peter Cartwright's ministry with a portrayal of his sermons at the town square at 2:30 p.m. Cartwright covered western Illinois in the 1830's bringing spiritual teaching and support in the early days of Illinois' settlement. As District Superintendent, then called

"Presiding Elder," it is very likely that he was involved in the establishment of the Knoxville church.

Cartwright, a contemporary and political rival of Abraham Lincoln defeated him in a race for representative in the state legislature in 1832 and was defeated by Lincoln in the Congressional race of 1846.

On Saturday night, there will be an evening "Celebration of Faith," at the fairgrounds. It will include an Ice Cream Social at 5:30. The Boy Scouts will be selling sandwiches. The pies entered in the contest will be auctioned at 6:30. There will be a concert of Gospel music by local talent at 7 p.m.

On Sunday there is a special worship service lead by Rev. J. W. Werner at the Methodist Church303 S. Broad St.

Come celebrate Jesus' presence on the Illinois frontier and enduring presence in Knoxville.



Rev. Dr. Christopher Ritter

Rev. Dr. Christopher Ritter grew up on a dairy farm in the Southern Tip of Illinois where he attended a 60-member United Methodist Church. He accepted Christ as his Savior at age 12 and entered the pastoral ministry at age 18. He graduated from Southern Methodist University in Dallas with a Doctor of Ministry in Evangelism. He also graduated magna cum laude from Candler School of Theology at Emory University (Atlanta) with a Master of Divinity degree and from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale with a degree in education.

Rev. Ritter is an ordained elder in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church and currently serves as the Directing Pastor of Geneseo First UMC. Other pastorates have included Glen Carbon New Bethel UMC, Camargo UMC, and Villa Grove UMC.

He lives with his wife, Becky, in Geneseo and the couple have four children. Becky is Director of Children's Ministry at Geneseo First UMC. Their daughter, Hannah (21), is a senior in Elementary Education at SIU Edwardsville. Isaac (20) attends Blackhawk College and is involved in community theatre and martial arts. Sarah (18) is a recent high school graduate and is entering Blackhawk College. Samuel (15) is a rising Sophomore at Geneseo High School and plays tennis.

Dr. Ritter is a 1999 inductee into World Methodist Evangelism's "Order of the Flame." He has a passion for church growth and vitality and connecting people with Jesus Christ.

Harvest Ministry Team with Tim Price

Tim Price began in music ministry during his senior year of high school. In 1990, the summer after graduating, Tim spent his summer singing at several camps. The first camp director to contact him had actually seen him in a high school musical. For the next four years, Tim attended McKendree College in Lebanon, Illinois and sang on the weekends and during the summers. During that time, the ministry grew, but Tim considered it something he would do while in college.

In the fall of 1994, Tim moved to Wilmore, Kentucky to attend school at Asbury Seminary. The ministry continued while he was working toward a Master's of Divinity at Asbury. It was 1996 when Tim began, with the help of many others, the Harvest Ministry Team as a way to train students for ministry. Tim continues to serve part-time on the staff at **Troy UMC**, while directing the work of Harvest Teams. Tim and his wife Suzanne and daughter Ruby live near Troy, Illinois.

Joel Catlin as Peter Courtwright

Rev. Joel Catlin of O'Fallon will portray circuit rider Peter Cartwright, whose name came to symbolize the drama of the westward movement of the church. Cartwright served as a circuit rider for 71 years, when half of all riders died by the age of 33. Cartwright is also known for losing an 1846 run for Congress to Abraham Lincoln.

Pastor Joel is the Associate Pastor, the Pastor of Discipleship at O'Fallon Methodist Church, and the point pastor at the church's extension site, Milburn Crossing. He has a passion for people and for God. He loves the outdoors and loves sharing it with others. He is a current board member of the O'Fallon YMCA and O'Fallon Sportsman Club, is active in Rotary, and is a Chamber of Commerce Ambassador. He is married to the Reverend Donna Catlin. They both enjoy theater and reaching people through the arts. They have three great sons and three wonderful daughters-in-law.
